## Morning Children

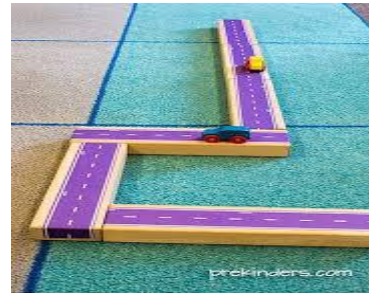
- Finding out about hygiene, especially washing our hands properly, before eating at café, after going to the toilet and throughout our time at nursery

- Creating roads for our small world cars using blocks



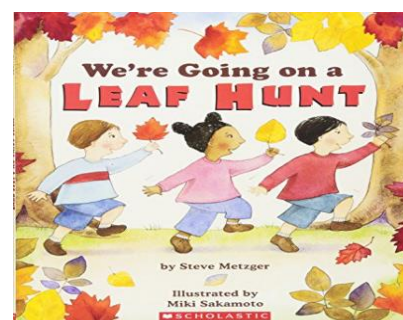
- Travelling across our textured stepping-stones

- Sharing the story 'We're Going on a Leaf Hunt'





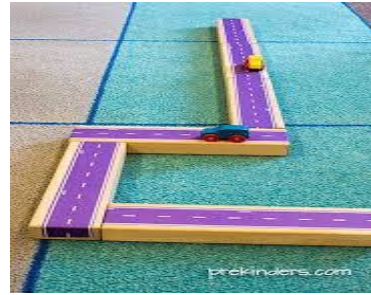
# What are we doing at Nursery this week? Afternoon Children

- Creating roads for our small world cars using blocks



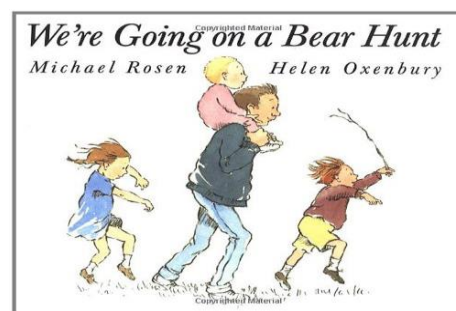
- Joining in with action songs and rhymes

## Working Together to Extend your Child's Learning at Home

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As we work in partnership with parents/carers we ask that you continue to enhance your child's learning and development this week through sharing and exploring with some or all of the following activities which you can enjoy together:



Looking for signs of Autumn in the environment and collecting conkers or other natural found objects, which can be used for accurate counting and making patterns.



Encourage your child to make marks using a variety of tools, using large arm movements with chinks or brushes and fine motor skills using pens or crayons. Talk to them about their pictures, encouraging them to give meanings to their marks.



Share favourite stories with your child, encourage them to listen with increasing attention and recall to the story afterwards.
