- Pedalling bikes in our outdoor area




- Noticing our features as we draw and paint

- Scooting along on wheeled toys in our outdoor area




- Experimenting with marks as we draw on large paper and paint using brushes

# Working Together to Extend your Child's Learning at Home

As we work in partnership with parents/carers we ask that you continue to enhance your child's learning and development this week through sharing and exploring with some or all of the following activities which you can enjoy together:



Share favourite stories with your child, encourage them to listen with increasing attention and recall to the story afterwards.



Encourage accurate counting with your child in play based activities. Draw their attention to numerals in the environment.



Encourage your child to make marks using a variety of tools, using large arm movements with chalks or brushes and fine motor skills using pens or crayons. Talk to them about their pictures, encouraging them to give meanings to their marks.
