- Exploring with our senses as we experiment with sand and mousse



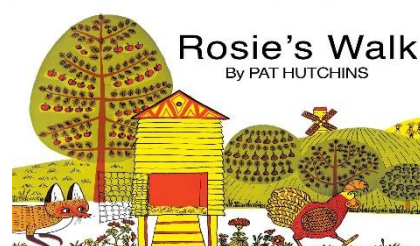
- Using our fine motor and counting skills as we use pegs to represent the number of spikes on our hedgehogs back

# What are we doing at Nursery this week? Afternoon Children

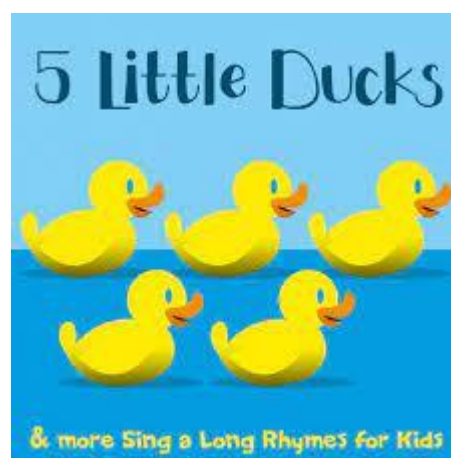
- Building up our core strength by accessing 'tummy time' to carry out activities

- Saying some counting words as jump between sensory tiles



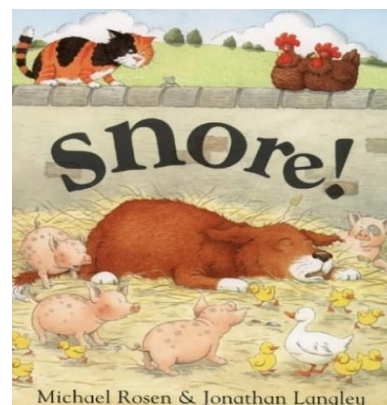
- Joining in with songs and rhymes as we focus on the rhyme

# Working Together to Extend your Child's Learning at Home

## Working Together to Extend your Child's Learning at Home

As we work in partnership with parents/carers we ask that you continue to enhance your child's learning and development this week through sharing and exploring with some or all of the following activities which you can enjoy together:



Looking for signs of Autumn in the environment and collecting conkers or other natural found objects, which can be used for accurate counting and making patterns.



Encourage your child to make marks using a variety of tools, using large arm movements with chinks or brushes and fine motor skills using pens or crayons. Talk to them about their pictures, encouraging them to give meanings to their marks.



Share favourite stories with your child, encourage them to listen with increasing attention and recall to the story afterwards.
