- Using our physical strength to pull ourselves up whilst accessing our outdoor climbing frame



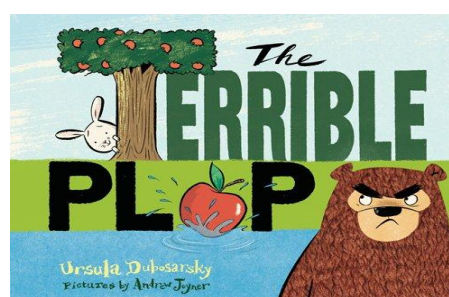
- Experimenting with scissors whilst snipping greetings cards

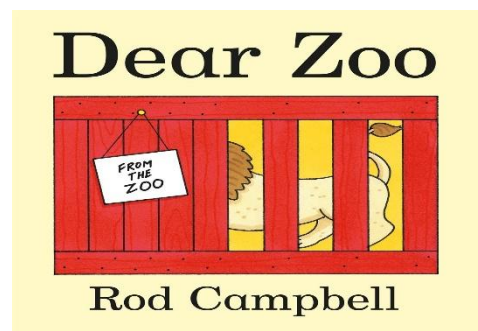

Share favourite stories with your child, encourage them to listen with increasing attention and recall to the story afterwards.



Encourage accurate counting with your child in play based activities. Draw their attention to numerals in the environment.



Encourage your child to make marks using a variety of tools, using large arm movements with chalks or brushes and fine motor skills using pens or crayons. Talk to them about their pictures, encouraging them to give meanings to their marks.
